# ABOUT PARIVAAR

- Founded in 2003 near Kolkata, with Just 3 Children in a Rented Building
- At present, working in 4 states, serving more than
   63 thousand children and lakhs of adults
- Areas: Child Care, Education, Health and Nutrition
- Parivaar's Founder is Mr. Vinayak Lohani (Padma Shri 2025; Distinguished Alumnus of IIT Kharagpur & IIM Calcutaa; National Award for Child Welfare 2011)

## RESIDENTIAL INSTITUTIONS IN WEST BENGAL

- West Bengal's Largest Free Residential Educational Institution for children from highly impoverished backgrounds.
- Parivaar provides Total Support Schooling, Residence, Food, Medical support, Clothes etc.
- As of September '25 more than 2100 resident children (more than 1000 in boys and girls campus each).
- 15 batches of our children have passed Grade 10 Board Examination. 98% of them have done so in their first attempt despite being late starters in school education.
- 13 batches of our children have passed Grade 12 Board Examination. 97% of them have done so in their first attempt despite being late starters in school education.
- More than 500 boys and girls have got gainfully employed after their skilling/employability program and/or University Level Education.

# 1. SEVA KUTIRS: Day-Boarding Supplementary Educationcum-Nutrition Centers

- Village community provided venue zero infra costs.
- More than 60 thousand children served in 940 plus villages across 19 districts in MP and 1 district each in Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand
- Education in morning & evening shifts along with light nutrition.

• Staff is mostly taken from the Local tribal community

## SEVA KUTIRS: TYPES

#### 1. Full Service Seva Kutirs:

In this format, along with two shifts of education and overall development, a morning breakfast and full evening dinner (roti, sabji, dal, rice) are given.

#### 2. Shiksha Kutirs:

In this format, along with two shifts of education and overall development, in both the shifts nutritious snacks are given.

#### 3. Study Centres:

This comprises two shifts of education and overall development.

We are endeavouring to set up 1000 such centers by December 2025, serving at least 80,000 children in some of the most impoverished tribal pockets of the state.

### 2. 24\*7 AMBULANCE SERVICES

- 94 Ambulances operating 24\*7 in Extremeley Remote & Poor Tribal Areas in 23 Districts of Madhya Pradesh.
- Cater to 2-3 patients daily and run 100-150 kms.
- These have served more than 3.4 lakh persons since inception in June 2021.
- Emergency transportation to nearest govt. hospitals
- Information about this is circulated among the Panchayat officials, village health workers etc.
- 2 drivers and 2 attendants on each ambulance for day and night shift









## 3. MOBILE MEDICAL CLINICS

- Running 43 Mobile Clinics in 20 Districts
- A Qualified Doctor Visits 4-5 villages daily & treats patients
- Daily 100-150 cases are treated & medicines provided
- More than 19 lakh persons served since inception in June 2021
- 2,243 villages being served on a fortnightly basis.
- Patients who require more advanced care are sent to advanced facilities in Delhi, Bhopal, Indore, Nagpur etc.








## 4. VISION RESTORATION PROGRAM

- Thousands of Persons, esp. Elderly, Suffer from Cataract &
   Other Eye Ailments
- We Collaborate with Some Highly Reputed & Big Eye Hospitals in the Region
- Patients are examined, given medication, and glasses during eye camps.
- Those in Need of Surgery are Taken to the Hospital by Parivaar

#### 5. RESIDENTIAL INSTITUTIONS IN MADHYA PRADESH

#### Parivaar Swami Vivekananda Sevashram, Village - Sandalpur, District Dewas

This free residential campus is spread over an area of 17 acres. There are 1078 resident children (748 boys and 330 girls) in this campus at present studying in Grades 6 to 11. It has started from the Academic Session 2021-22.

#### Swami Vivekananda Vidyapeeth, Village – Amla Noabad, District Sehore

This campus has started functioning from July 2022. There are around 350 children from highly impoverished tribal communities of 6 districts in MP – Khandwa, Betul, Vidisha, Alirajpur, Barwani and Sheopur.

#### Mandla Town

We are running two hostels – Parivaar Bhagini Nivedita Sadan (for girls) and Parivaar Swami Vivekananda Vidyarthi Sadan (for boys) for children from impoverished tribal families of several villages in Mandla district. The hostels are in Mandla town, and the children are enrolled in the Government Schools in the town. There are around 177 (119 Girls and 58 Boys), studying in Grades 9 to 12. There are some children who are pursuing University education too.
